Coronavirus Update

We have had no further Covid cases in school or cases reported in pupil households this week.

The latest data for Trafford continues to show a decrease in infections. The Trafford rate of 24 per 100,000 people is similar to the rate last summer. Trafford Public Health are very pleased by this rate and hope very much that it will not rise over the coming weeks especially when the effects of the restrictions eased at Easter are seen. We continue to ask parents and children over 12 to wear masks on our grounds (unless you have an exemption). We will review this again in May and if infection rates remain low, we plan to make masks optional.



This week a parent of one of our pupils donated some reusable cloth face masks from her employer. They are meant for children but do fit some adults. They have adjustable fittings and are various designs. We are selling them to raise money for school fund—50 p per mask. Please call at the school office if you would like to buy any.

We are planning a 'clothes and shoes' collection so that families can donate any items that they no longer need. These will be collected and weighed then money given to school by the company who organise this. We are not sure where restrictions will be up to by the summer and wish to organise some 'covid' proof opportunities to raise some money for school fund.
